Goals

Despite the evolutions in legislation, policy and practice, social professionals still experience shared barriers for young children (0-12) to participate in youth care.

The Panda project responds to this by supporting them in:

- creating cooperation conditions to work more participatively with young children
- strengthening the competences of practitioners
- the implementation of a participatory approach
- teaching (new) participatory tools by providing materials for trainers and educators

Target group

Social workers, educators, psychologists, coaches, managers, policy makers, academics, trainers,... within the sector of youth care and youth protection.

Achievements

A media library

The Panda library collects participatory methodologies and tools for practitioners to use in their interaction with young children.

Policy- en management tools

Panda offers policy makers, managers and practitioners a guide to support them in implementing a participatory approach in the organization. The guide is not a user manual, but offers tools to determine a vision, objectives and a way of working within your own context.

A toolkit for trainers

Panda developed a toolkit for trainers to train social professionals in realizing participatory practice with young children.

The toolkit consists of 4 parts that can be used separately with help from a manual: application in practice of the CRC, challenges and opportunities, group participation, methodologies and tools.

Everything is offered through a variety of texts and background material, podcasts and videos with interviews and testimonials, all in Dutch, English, Spanish and Norwegian.
